Items to be Compared	Basis of Comparison	Categories of Comparison
<p>What two things will be compared?</p>	<p>Why are we comparing the two items? What is our purpose and goal?</p>	<p>How will the items be compared? What elements of the items will be compared?</p>
<p>Example: Articles by Wohlsen and Prensky.</p>	<p>Example: Compare and contrast how Wohlsen and Prensky define digital literacy and what role education should play in achieving it.</p>	<p>Example: We will compare and contrast based on three categories – definition of digital literacy, criteria for achieving it, and the role of education in achieving it.</p>
